



#### **Business Description**

NBI Bearings Europe SA is engaged in designing and production of bearings. Its product offerings include cylindrical roller bearings, tapered roller bearings, spherical roller bearings, needle roller bearings, support rollers, cam followers, cylindrical roller thrust bearings, spherical roller thrust bearings and ball bearings. The company also provides technical services, bearing selection, training and tailor made solutions.

#### Valuation Qas of 2 May 2024

Morningstar affirms a 3-star quantitative rating for NBI Bearings Europe. We calculate this outcome using the company's underlying model-driven valuation and uncertainty scores.

The stock's last closing price was 4.66, a discount of 11.37% to its Quantitative Fair Value estimate of 5.26. This discount has ranged between 29.61% and 4.18% over the past year. The stock's price to fair value ratio is at the 77th percentile in our global equity coverage universe for this methodology and at the 65th percentile relative to its peers in the industrials sector.

NBI Bearings Europe furthermore holds a Very High quantitative uncertainty rating.

The company's quantitative star rating dates to after 12/01/2023, before which it was 4-star. Similarly, the firm's uncertainty rating changed from High to Very High after 04/22/2024.

We examine the financials and market statistics for NBI Bearings Europe to determine these ratings. Its earnings yield is 2.03% and its trailing 12-month maximum drawdown is 22.45%. These fall at the 46th and 36th percentiles in the equity universe and at the 33rd and 42nd in the industrials sector, respectively.

Quantitatively, we believe NBI Bearings Europe has a Narrow economic moat. Its moat score of 0.76 corresponds to the 69th percentile in the industrials sector. Furthermore, this rating last differed from its previous rating of None on 04/01/2024, when the company's moat score fell from its maximum of 0.89 (score of 1 indicates greatest economic moat).

The company also maintains a quantitative financial health rating of Moderate. Its score sits at the 54th percentile in both the universe and sector.

Examining the company's financials and market statistics, we find these ratings are principally driven by its book value yield and enterprise value-to-market value ratio. The book value yield is 32.85%, sitting at the 30th percentile in the industrials sector. The company's enterprise value-to-market value ratio is 1.29, corresponding to the 69th percentile in the equity coverage universe and the 68th percentile in the sector.

### Fundamentals as of 2 May 2024

NBI Bearings Europe reports earnings per share of 0.09. Its return on invested capital is 4.25%. These values are calculated over a trailing 12-month period.

As of last market close, NBI Bearings Europe has a price-to-earnings ratio of 49.31, falling at the 88th percentile in its sector (where a lower percentile means a lower ratio) and ranging between 41.24 and 95.24 over the past year.

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

# **Quantitative Equity Report Overview**

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar, Inc., Mr. Davidson is guided by Morningstar, Inc.'s Code of Ethics and Personal Securities Trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

### **Quantitative Equity Ratings**

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analyst-driven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

- i. Quantitative Fair Value Estimate: Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. Please go to http://global.morningstar.com/equitydisclosures for information about Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies.
- ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

**Narrow** – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

**Wide** — assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

**None** — assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

- iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10%
Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15%
but greater than 10%

 $\overrightarrow{\text{High}}-\text{the}$  interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

**Very High** – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

### Other Definitions

- i. Last Close Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.
- Quantitative Valuation— Using the below terms, intended to denote the relationship between the security's Last Price and Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate for that security.

**Undervalued – Last Price** is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

**Farily Valued – Last Price** is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value

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Sustainalytics analyzes over 1,300 data points to assess a company's exposure to and management of ESG risks. In other words, ESG Risk Ratings measures a company's unmanaged ESG Risks represented as a quantitative score. Unmanaged Risk is measured on an open-ended scale starting at zero (no risk) with lower scores representing less unmanaged risk and, for 95% of cases, the unmanaged ESG Risk score is below 50.

Based on their quantitative scores, companies are grouped into one of five Risk Categories (negligible, low, medium, high, severe). These risk categories are absolute, meaning that a 'high risk' assessment reflects a comparable degree



of unmanaged ESG risk across all subindustries covered.

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
