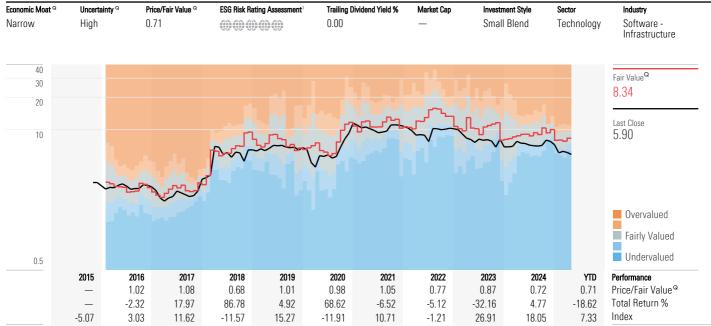

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Business Description

Gigas Hosting SA provides platforms for cloud hosting. The company offers various solutions including contingency (D&R) service that enables companies of any size to implement and integrate automatic protection; SAP required infrastructure and cloud server for Oracle. Its product offerings include cloud datacenter, firewall, load balancer and cloud VPS (Virtual Private Server).

Valuation as of 8 Apr 2025

Gigas Hosting SA earns a 5-star quantitative star rating, reflecting our opinion that this share class offers a compelling opportunity for investors. The stock currently trades at a 29% discount to our quantitative fair value estimate of 8.34 EUR per share; however, caution is warranted due to this estimate's high uncertainty rating.

The firm's valuation metrics strengthen our estimated fair value. A company's valuation metrics provide insights into the market's expectations for its future growth and profitability. Reflecting the firm's valuation is its enterprise value to EBITDA ratio of 3.4, which falls in the bottom 10% compared with peers globally. Relative to the company's EBITDA, the enterprise value of the business is low, which contributes to our view that shares are undervalued

The firm's solid growth is an additional encouraging factor. Consistent revenue and earnings growth indicates a company's potential for increased market share and profitability. The firm's revenue 5-year growth of 49.5%, for example, falls in the top 10% compared with global peers. Relatively strong trailing five-year revenue growth suggests a compelling trajectory for future sales and earnings, which further promotes our favorable

price/fair value ratio.

In addition to the aforementioned drivers, our model considers momentum as part of its comprehensive analysis. This share class has been a laggard relative to the broader universe over the past year. This underperformance makes the stock appear cheap, which portends a buying opportunity in light of other contributors to our model.

Economic Moat as of 8 Apr 2025

The narrow moat rating for this company indicates investors can expect it to generate 10 years or more of excess returns on capital due to its respectable competitive advantages. In addition, the company's moderate financial health score is decent and doesn't seriously concern us with regard to financial distress.

Quantitative Equity Report Overview

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Jeffrey Ptak, Chief Ratings Officer for Morningstar Research Services LLC is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar Research Services LLC, a subsidiary of Morningstar, Inc, Mr Ptak is guided by the Morningstar Research Services' Code of Ethics and the Morningstar, Inc. Code of Ethics and Personal Securities trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analyst-driven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

- i. Quantitative Fair Value Estimate: Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. Please go to http://global.morningstar.com/equitydisclosures for information about Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies.
- ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide — assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None – assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

- iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.
 - ★ the stock is overvalued with a reasonable margin of safety.

Under Review — Morningstar will assign a rating of "Under Review" in three scenarios: when there is occurrence of a corporate event, when the closing price is unavailable for at least 7 days, or when the quantitative Fair Value to Price Ratio does not fall into the expected range of 0.25-4.

Not Rated — Morningstar will assign a rating of 'Not Rated' when closing price data is unavailable for at least 30 days.

Momentum Flag — After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars.

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10% **Medium** – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15% but greater than 10%

 $\mbox{\bf High}-\mbox{\bf the interquartile}$ range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

 $\mbox{\sc Very High}-\mbox{\sc the interquartile}$ range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

 $\ensuremath{\textit{Extreme}}$ — the interquartile range for possible fair values is greater than 80%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

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 Moderate – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health is between 0.2
 and 0.7

Strong – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health > 0.7

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- i. Last Close Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.
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Undervalued – Last Price is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate

Fairly Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

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Unmanaged Risk is measured on an open-ended scale starting at zero (no risk) with lower scores representing less unmanaged risk and, for 95% of cases, the unmanaged ESG Risk score is below 50.

Based on their quantitative scores, companies are grouped into one of five Risk Categories (negligible, low, medium, high, severe). These risk categories are absolute, meaning that a 'high risk' assessment reflects a comparable degree of unmanaged ESG risk across all subindustries covered.

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
