


Business Description

Proeduca Altus SA is engaged in the business of providing online education. The business has its presence in Spain, Ecuador, Colombia, Mexico, Peru, Argentina, Bolivia and the USA.

Valuation[®]as of 3 May 2024

Morningstar maintains a 2-star quantitative star rating for Proeduca Altus, derived from the firm's valuation and uncertainty scores.

The company's shares last closed at 19.70, above our quantitative fair value estimate of 17.39. These shares have traded between a 4.76% discount and 20.48% premium to their fair value estimate over the past year. In Morningstar's equity coverage universe for this methodology, the company's valuation rating lands at the 95th percentile; in the consumer defensive sector, the firm's score lies at the 95th percentile (meaning the shares are more undervalued than 95% of stocks in the sector).

Furthermore, Proeduca Altus maintains a quantitative valuation uncertainty rating of High.

The company has held this star rating since the previous rating of 3, which was last assigned on 04/18/2024. The uncertainty rating for Proeduca Altus has remained High over the past year.

The key factors behind these ratings are the company's EV-MV ratio and volatility. The enterprise value-to-market value ratio is 0.90, and its maximum annualized trailing 12-month volatility is 18.84%. The EV-MV ratio falls at the 15th percentile in the consumer defensive sector while the volatility is at the 30th percentile. Over the past year, the company's EV-MV ratio has been between 0.89 and 0.94; its volatility has ranged between 14.18% and 18.84%.

Morningstar maintains a Wide quantitative moat

rating on the company. The firm's quantitative moat score of 0.99 sits at the 93rd percentile in the consumer defensive sector, the maximum of its moat scores over the past year.

The quantitative financial health rating for Proeduca Altus is Strong. Its financial health score, termed Distance to Default, sits at the 90th percentile in the universe and 94th percentile in the sector.

The significant drivers of these ratings are the company's book value yield and annualized trailing 12month volatility. The book value yield for Proeduca Altus is 1.07%, and its annualized trailing 12-month volatility is 18.37%. They sit at the 7th and 17th percentile in the global equity universe, respectively.

Fundamentals as of 3 May 2024

The earnings per share for Proeduca Altus is 0.77. The company earns a return on invested capital of 247.48%, falling at the 95th percentile in the consumer defensive sector. The firm maintains a dividend yield of 6.13%. We calculate the above figures over a trailing 12-month period.

Examining valuation further, we find Proeduca Altus holds a price-to-earnings ratio of 25.47, a figure greater than 69% of its sector peers. The company's price-to-free cash flow ratio is 15.92, greater than 54% of its sector peers. These values are calculated using the stock's price at last market close.



Quantitative Equity Report Overview

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar, Inc., Mr. Davidson is guided by Morningstar, Inc.'s Code of Ethics and Personal Securities Trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analystdriven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

i. **Quantitative Fair Value Estimate:** Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None – assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars.

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10% Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15% but greater than 10%

High – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

 $Very\ High\ -$ the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

 $\ensuremath{\textit{Extreme}}\xspace -$ the interquartile range for possible fair values is greater than 80%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Weak – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health < 0.2

Strong - assigned when Quantitative Financial Health > 0.7

Other Definitions

i. Last Close – Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.

ii. **Quantitative Valuation**– Using the below terms, intended to denote the relationship between the security's **Last Price** and Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate for that security.

Undervalued – Last Price is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

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Sustainalytics analyzes over 1,300 data points to assess a company's exposure to and management of ESG risks. In other words, ESG Risk Ratings measures a company's unmanaged ESG Risks represented as a quantitative score. Unmanaged Risk is measured on an open-ended scale starting at zero (no risk) with lower scores representing less unmanaged risk and, for 95% of cases, the unmanaged ESG Risk score is below 50.

Based on their quantitative scores, companies are grouped into one of five Risk Categories (negligible, low, medium, high, severe). These risk categories are absolute, meaning that a 'high risk' assessment reflects a comparable degree



of unmanaged ESG risk across all subindustries covered.

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale. Companies with Negligible Risk = 5 Globes, Low Risk = 4, Medium Risk = 3 Globes, High Risk = 2 Globes, Severe Risk = 1 Globe. For more information, please visit sustainalytics.com/esg-ratings/

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
