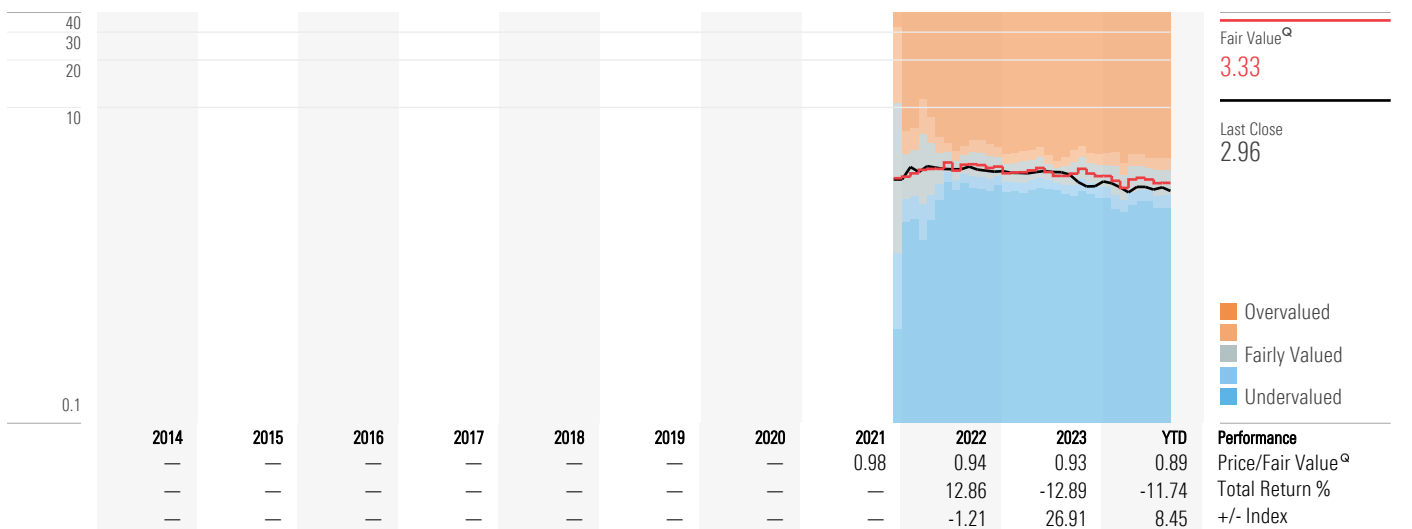

Business Description

Singular People SA is a software company. The company provides solutions to various industries including Energy & Utilities, Financial Services, Healthcare, Manufacturing, Retail, Museums, and Public services.

Valuation ^Q as of 9 Aug 2024

Morningstar affirms a 3-star quantitative rating for Singular People. We calculate this outcome using the company's underlying model-driven valuation and uncertainty scores.

The stock's last closing price was 2.96, a discount of 10.51% to its Quantitative Fair Value estimate of 3.31. The stock has been trading between a 24.38% discount and 6.14% premium to its quantitative fair value over the past year. The stock's price to fair value ratio is at the 83rd percentile in our global equity coverage universe for this methodology and at the 83rd percentile relative to its peers in the technology sector.

Singular People furthermore holds a Very High quantitative uncertainty rating.

The company's quantitative star rating dates to after 11/01/2023, before which it was 4-star. Similarly, the firm's uncertainty rating changed from High to Very High after 08/07/2024.

We examine the financials and market statistics for Singular People to determine these ratings. Its return on assets is 10.22 and its trailing 12-month maximum drawdown is 19.44%. These fall at the 89th and 30th percentiles in the equity universe and at the 85th and 17th in the technology sector, respectively.

With a Narrow Morningstar quantitative moat rating, the quantitative moat score for Singular People falls at the 74th percentile in both the technology

sector and equity coverage universe. The company has maintained its Narrow quantitative moat rating since after 08/07/2024, when it was upgraded from None.

We also assign a Moderate quantitative financial health rating to Singular People. The company's raw score on this metric, termed Distance to Default, ranks at the 66th percentile overall and in the technology sector. Furthermore, this financial health rating most recently changed from Strong after 09/22/2023.

Supporting these ratings are the company's book value yield and enterprise value-to-market value ratio. The book value yield of 28.69%, ranks at the 27th percentile in the covered equity universe and at the 39th percentile among its peers. Meanwhile, its enterprise value-to-market value ratio of 1.03, falls at the 48th percentile in the universe and the 61st percentile in the technology sector.

Fundamentals as of 9 Aug 2024

Singular People maintains earnings per share of 0.14. The company further earns a return on invested capital of 13.2%. The shares offer a dividend yield of 1.31%. These values are calculated over a trailing 12-month period.

As of last market close, Singular People has a price-to-earnings ratio of 21.81, falling below the 45th percentile in its sector (where a lower percentile means a lower ratio) and ranging between 21.66 and 30.26 over the past year. The company's price-to-free cash flow ratio is 25.09, falling at the 58th percentile in its sector and ranging between 24.92 and 32.6 over the past year.

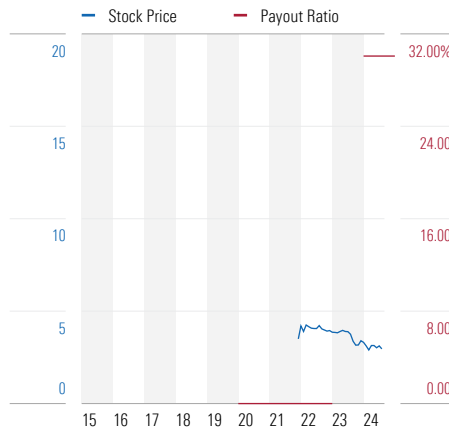

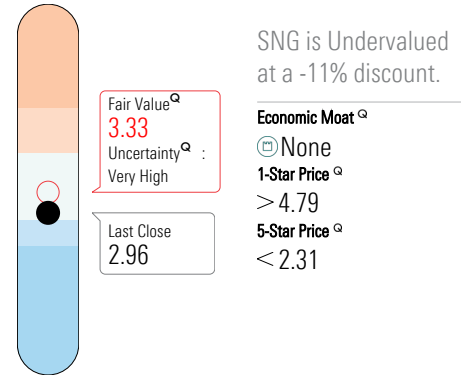

Quantitative Equity Report Overview

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar, Inc., Mr. Davidson is guided by Morningstar, Inc.'s Code of Ethics and Personal Securities Trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings").

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analyst-driven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

i. **Quantitative Fair Value Estimate:** Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. Please go to <http://global.morningstar.com/equitydisclosures> for information about Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies.

ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None – assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars.

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10%

Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15% but greater than 10%

High – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

Very High – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

Extreme – the interquartile range for possible fair values is greater than 80%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Weak – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health < 0.2

Moderate – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health is between 0.2 and 0.7

Strong – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health > 0.7

Other Definitions

i. **Last Close** – Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.

ii. **Quantitative Valuation** – Using the below terms, intended to denote the relationship between the security's **Last Price** and Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate for that security.

Undervalued – Last Price is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Fairly Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Fairly Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

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Sustainalytics analyzes over 1,300 data points to assess a company's exposure to and management of ESG risks. In other words, ESG Risk Ratings measures a company's unmanaged ESG Risks represented as a quantitative score. Unmanaged Risk is measured on an open-ended scale starting at zero (no risk) with lower scores representing less unmanaged risk and, for 95% of cases, the unmanaged ESG Risk score is below 50.

Based on their quantitative scores, companies are grouped into one of five Risk Categories (negligible, low, medium, high, severe). These risk categories are absolute, meaning that a 'high risk' assessment reflects a comparable degree

of unmanaged ESG risk across all subindustries covered.

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale. Companies with Negligible Risk = 5 Globes, Low Risk = 4, Medium Risk = 3 Globes, High Risk = 2 Globes, Severe Risk = 1 Globe. For more information, please visit sustainalytics.com/esg-ratings/

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
